

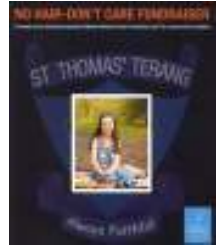
New Literacy Resource

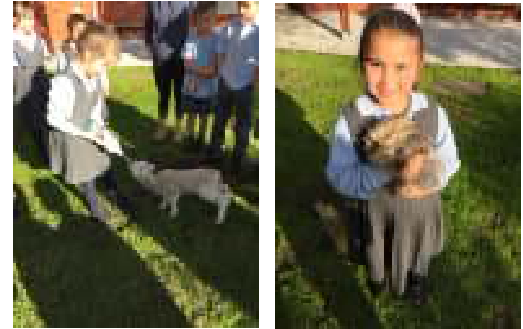

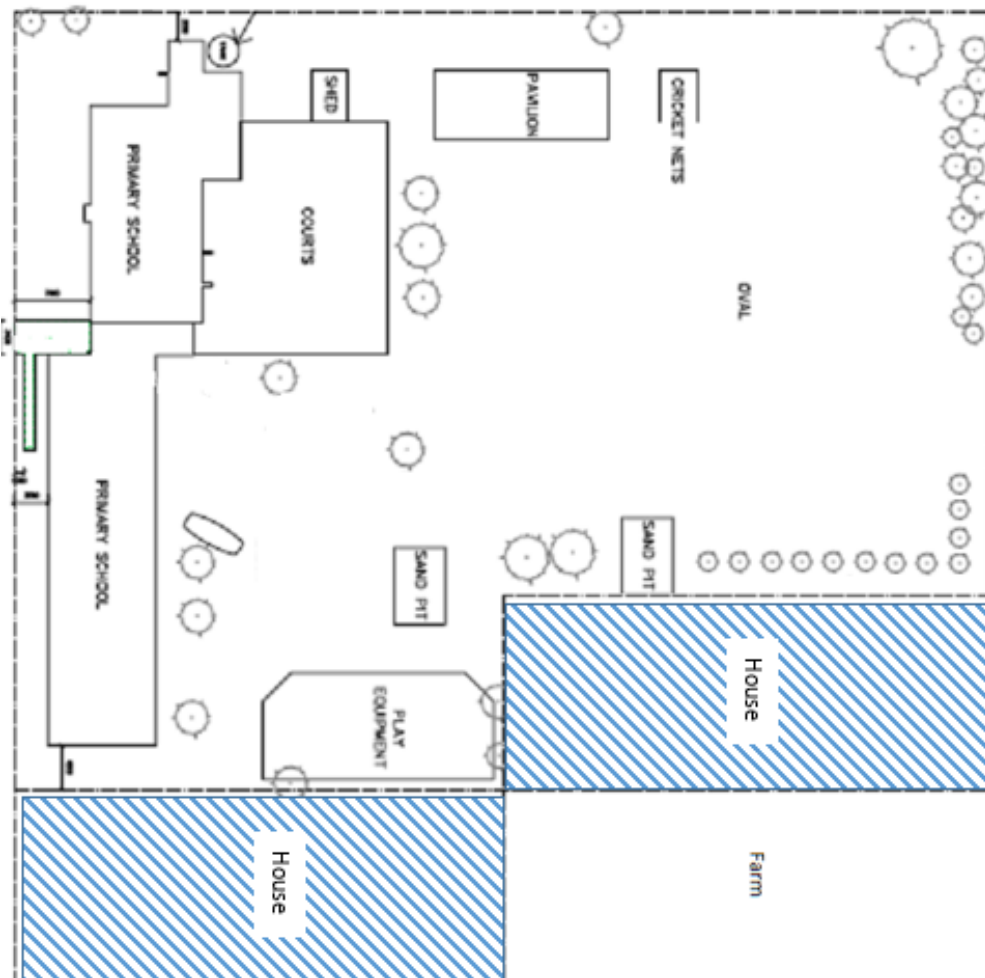
